As a dancer at Centerville Academy, I agree to:

- 1) Keep a respectful distance from other dancers while in class, including not touching each other, unless specifically instructed by my teacher to hold hands.
- 2) Listen to my teacher, and respond to her correction. Most importantly, if she tells me to stop doing any of the following: pinching, kicking, hitting, pulling hair, scratching, shoving, elbowing, licking, and/or spitting, I will be quick to listen and not do these things in class!
